# FROM THE CHAIR

Thank you to Parish Councillors for their work over the last year. Parish Council meetings continue to take place at the Bromham Village Hall and are open to the public. The meetings are advertised on the website and on noticeboards.

Although there had been vacancies throughout the year, the Parish Council were delighted to co-opt some new Councillors during 2023/2024, and although there continues to be some vacancies, the Parish Council are hopeful for further recruits in the coming months.

Work on the Bromham Mill project continues, following the full planning permission received early this year. The Parish Council are in the process of discharging the conditions that formed part of the approval process.

As most are aware, the Bromham Residents Group was then formed after the approval to challenge the consented scheme. It is disappointing that some of our Councillors had to contend with targeted comments from people in the community.

Of course, Bromham Mill is only one of the services provided for residents, and the Parish Council work hard to give equal attention to issues that arise throughout the year.

The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group continues to review the existing plan for Bromham. The group had received the responses to the questionnaire sent to all residents and are in the process of reviewing the results; these will be available soon. The Parish Council had been awarded grants to enable the Steering Group to commission reports for a Housing Needs Assessment, Site Assessments and a Design Code from AECOM, and the Steering Group are also working on the preparation of a Green Infrastructure Plan with Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity (BRCC).

In addition to the day-to-day working of the Parish Council, Parish Councillors also work hard to provide, and volunteer to run, some much loved and well attended events. The team were blessed with fine weather for both Apple Day and the Christmas Carols event which made it far more enjoyable for everyone in attendance.

The Parish Council held the Annual Meeting and Community Awards evening at the Allotments this year and are very grateful to Alan and Judy Plater for hosting and providing the refreshments. This is an opportunity for volunteer groups to get together and discuss their year. It was good to see it so well attended. Framed certificates were then awarded to individuals in recognition of their contribution to the Bromham community.

I would like to thank Phil Grabham, Peter Argyle and the conservation volunteers, who continue to organise work on open spaces within the village – notably Salem Thrift, Nature Reserve and Bromham Mill – particularly the very popular Woodland Walk.

I would also like to thank Dylan Simmons and Robert Rigby, Bromham's Borough Councillors, for their hard work and support for Bromham.

Thank you also to Julie Betts, Parish Clerk, for her continued dedication and support to Bromham Parish Council, and to the residents.

Finally, thank you to my fellow Councillors, with a huge debt of gratitude, for their full support and commitment. It had been a difficult year, and I am sorry that, as willing volunteers, Parish Councillors had at times had to deal with situations that had made them uncomfortable in their role as Councillors.

### The Regeneration of Bromham Mill

The purpose of this communication is to further clarify the intent and circumstances behind the proposed development of Bromham Mill. Please find below further clarification of this project.

#### Objective Summary

- ✓ To develop Bromham Mill as an asset for our community, retaining its heritage by restoring the mill, the mill house, the foot barn, 200000 and the workshop barn for future generations.
- ✓ To maintain the green space around the mill. The mill and associated buildings are very important to the character of the site and will be retained and maintained to be enjoyed by all visitors.
- ✓ To move the mill into the listed front barn with appropriate restoration so that it can be used energy and commercially efficiently and providing a great place to meet for 0000000000 and visitors to Bromham.
- ✓ To restore the Listed Mill to a Museum and Arts and Educational facility. This would attract funding for the upkeep and restoration of the mill which would not be available if run as a commercial enterprise. The Milling wheel and equipment is fully operational but is in desperate need of restoration to ensure that their milling process can be operated and demonstrated for interested visitors and educational purposes.
- ✓ To restore and improve the Mill House which is not listed but is within the curtilage and is important to the character of the site. This development will clearly provide accommodation for small local businesses in the Health & Wellbeing sector.
- ✓ To restore the workshop barn which is adjacent to the toilets to provide an artisan workshop facility.
- ✓ To restore the stables adjacent to the Mill House to create small local business units, e.g. Farm Shop, Florist, short lease pop-up shops.
- ✓ To replace the current toilet facilities which are inadequate and will be replaced with a new accessible facility.
- ✓ To provide 6 small Commercial office units for local Businesses if required in the future. At this stage this is only an option and will be a consideration for the future.
- ✓ To provide a suitable car park for the site based on Bedford Borough Council planning requirements understanding this will necessitate moving the Badger Set. This would be carried out by an Ecology & Environmental Specialist. The Car Park will be installed with low level energy efficient lighting for safety purposes.
- ✓ To provide a loading bay for deliveries to the cafe and other small businesses.

#### Not Included in the Plan:

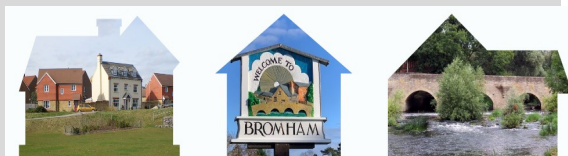
- ✗ **Glamping** - There will be no glamping or camping at Bromham Mill.
- ✗ **Wedding Venue** - The Mill site will not be used for a Wedding Venue.
- ✗ **Showers** - There will be no Showers in the Toilet facilities, as reflected in the revised and approved plans.

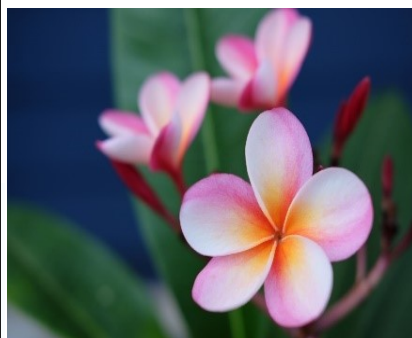

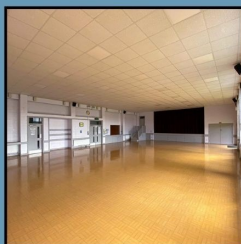

# Bromham Conservation Group

There are many opportunities to volunteer in Bromham, with a choice of local charities and voluntary groups working for worthy causes. Voluntary groups often work together where co-operation can make a difference. Bromham Conservation Group volunteers have worked for years with Friends of Bromham Mill and the Bromham Nature Club on improving and developing the attractive grounds at the Mill. We also recently supported the Elisabeth Curtis Centre, Riding for the Disabled, by helping to restore a ride overgrown with weeds and brambles.

Our volunteers work with the borough and parish councils to maintain public open spaces in the village. We help maintain and improve the grounds at Bromham Mill, the ancient woodland at Salem Thrift off Northampton Road, the Community Orchard at Parklands, the Bromham Lake Local Nature Reserve in Lower Farm Road, and the wildlife pond at Paddock Green off Oakley Road.

We continue to develop the woodland fairy walk at the Mill, creating areas with rustic fencing made from fallen wood from around the site. One has been used for new spring flowers planted by the Bromham Mill Nature Club, the other has become a pollinators garden. We have also created a new path along the brook behind the Mill, routing it away from the bank in places and, with help from the Nature Club, building a new log safety barrier where the bank is steep. In Salem Thrift, we have continued traditional hazel coppicing, led by a member with experience in woodland management. Hawthorn hedges have been planted to restrict access to coppiced areas, helping to protect the bluebells and other woodland flowers.

New volunteers are always welcome to our conservation work around the village, or to work on joint projects with other voluntary groups. We were recently pleased to welcome volunteers from the Bedfordshire Opportunities for Learning Disabilities, who have made their own contribution to the woodland at the Mill.

There is a wide variety of activities and something for everyone prepared to donate a little time for the common good. We now normally meet on the 2nd and 4th Sunday morning plus one weekday morning each month. We also join forces with the Mill Volunteers group every Monday afternoon. To find out more, sign up for our monthly email newsletter, or visit our Facebook page at [@BromhamConservationGroup](#). Our programme is also posted on the village website.

Local people have kindly donated spare materials and equipment for our work since the Group was founded in 2008. We welcome hawthorn cuttings for hedging at Salem Thrift or dogwood to plant in the fairy walk at the Mill. We can also make good use of spare 18mm and 12mm plywood or 50 x 25mm roofing battens, which make excellent supports for young trees.
