Our Mill volunteers have been working hard over the last few months to refurbish the mill wheel. The wheel was in such bad condition that it had to be locked off to save it from further damage.

Mill Engineering volunteers David Butler, Peter Wisson and Nick White identified the project and with the help of Cllr Kevin Rutter and Cllr Brian Bennett applied for funding for £14,000 to carry out the work.



Thank you to Bedford Borough Council UK Prosperity Fund for agreeing to fund this important project and thank you to all our volunteers for working so hard in the cold to complete the work! It is hoped that by the Spring visitors will again be able to see the mill wheel turning.

There are many improvements being made at the Village Hall, which will benefit all our users. This has been thanks in the main to Louisa Dahl – Chair of the Village Hall committee. – who has prepared bids for grant funding also from the UK Prosperity Fund, which has been successful.

Finally, I would like to welcome Val Brinson as a new Parish Councillor. Val needs little introduction, as she previously was on the Parish Council and rejoins after a couple of years' break.

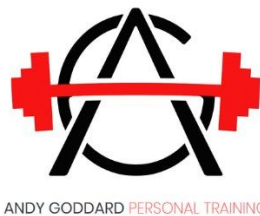

The Almonds Pre-School

9am - 1pm daily during term time for children from 2 years

The Almonds Pre-School operates from the very spacious well appointed Village Hall adjacent to the local Lower School in the picturesque village of Bromham. The pre-school has been established since 1966 and we are proud of the fact that we have very long serving members of staff. We operate during term time only between the hours of 9 am through till 12 noon with the option of staying till 1pm with a healthy packed lunch. We have an extensive range of equipment & resources, which is upgraded and added to on a regular basis. Children during the session are allowed freedom to interact with other children as well as adults in order to maximise their social skills. It is important that children learn at an early age to develop relationships, begin to behave in an appropriate manner and be happy and confident. During the session children can participate in all sorts of activities, play with other children, alongside other children or in large/small groups. They can use and enjoy books; they can increase their fine motor skills by using brushes, scissors and other appropriate tools. They have the opportunity to develop gross motor skills by climbing, running and balancing on large equipment. They can develop many other skills whilst participating in one/one adult directed activities. We encourage singing, rhymes, games and action based activities by use of a variety of musical instruments including taped musical accompaniments.

All children are expected to wear soft shoes and have matching drawstring bags. This encourages recognition of belongings and develops personal independence.

We have a good relationship with our local lower school and teachers visit the pre-school children on a number of occasions prior to transferring which gives the children the opportunity to become familiar with what will be their new classes and teachers.

We have two musical mornings during the year including our Christmas party. We also have sports day and other events as needed.

February

Monday 3, 10, 17, 24; 13:30 to 15:30 - Volunteers at Bromham Mill

Range of tasks as required, including gardening, woodland and fairy walk improvement, and surfacing paths. Meet by volunteers' mini-barn. Monday afternoon sessions almost always end with a social cuppa and a biscuit in the nature barn.

Sunday 9, Wednesday 19; 10:00 to 12:30(ish) - Bromham Community Orchard (behind the Greys Education Centre on Chestnut Avenue) Pruning apple and pear trees and clearing brambles and other encroaching vegetation to maintain paths for riders and walkers. Meet on the car park by the football field: please don't park in the turning space at the top of Parkland lane.

Sunday 23; 10:00 to 12:30(ish) - Paddock pond (Millennium Green, top of Lower Farm Road) Trimming the blackthorn hedge surrounding the pond and removing vegetation encroaching on to the green. We will not work in or close to the water to avoid disturbing great crested newts. Meet on site, park on Lower Farm Road.

March

Monday 3, 10, 17, 24, 31; 13:30 to 15:30 - Volunteers at Bromham Mill Range of tasks as required, including gardening, woodland and fairy walk improvement, and surfacing paths. Meet by volunteers' mini-barn. Monday afternoon sessions almost always end with a social cuppa and a biscuit in the nature barn.

Sunday 9; 10:00 to 12:30(ish) Paddock pond (Millennium Green, top of Lower Farm Road) Continuing work from February to reduce the blackthorn surrounding the pond and cutting back vegetation encroaching on to the green. Meet on site, park on Lower Farm Road.

Wednesday 19, Sunday 30; 10:00 to 12:30(ish) - Bromham Lake Local Nature Reserve (on right at bottom of Lower Farm Road) Clearing brambles and other vegetation obstructing public paths. Park and meet opposite entrance to the allotments just before the railway bridge.

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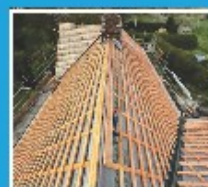
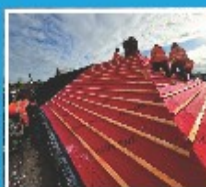
